FROM MILAN TO LECCO ALONG LEONARDO DA VINCI'S WATERWAYS 3rd stretch from Paderno to the city of Lecco



ITINERARY DESCRIPTION

The third stretch of the route, dedicated to the Adda river, begins at Paderno d'Adda station and arrives in the City of Lecco where it's possible to return to your starting point via train. The excursion may be completed in both directions. We suggest you start in the south and pedal toward Lecco as one single itinerary of three days. In this case the tour is a full day of calm pedaling, enjoying the views and visiting all of the suggested locations. You will start with a jump into the past of areas rich with biodiversity starting with the town of Paderno famous for the historic Saint Michael's bridge and the Naviglio (a navigable canal) designed by Leonardo Da Vinci. You'll pass through the town of Imbersago where there's still the functional and famous ferry of Leonardo. A must-see stop is Brivio to visit the castle and the ex Filanda Carozzi to then continue all the way to the sanctuary of the Rocchetta di Airuno, and the monastery of Santa Maria del Lavello, and the Civic Museum of silk Abegg. Crossing the bridge Azzone Visconti with next to it the island Viscontea, you will reach Lecco to immerse ourselves in the historic alleyways of this marvelous and eclectic city.

Return: You may take the train from Lecco or retrace your steps. If you would like to stay in Lecco, we suggest you visit the city which offers many activities. For sustainable tourism we suggest you utilize the train. You may reserve bicycles through www.eguidex-





PADERNO D'ADDA

The Adda stretch in the territory of Paderno is one of the most evocative in the middle course of the river that runs more than 80 meters below the countryside. Paderno D'Adda is located on the border of the Brianza Lecchese with the province of Monza and Bergamo, situated on the other side of the river. The village is known for the

Il Known also as Paderno's or Calusco's bridge,

this majestic structure from the late 1800s con-

nects the two towns of Paderno and Calusco.

The bridge reminds of the Eiffel Tower and, as

a matter of fact, the two structures share the

same construction epoch (1887-1889) and

the same construction technique (iron be-

ams). The bridge is 266m long and 85m high.

famous Saint Michael Bridge and the hydraulic gates for pound locks designed by Leonardo called the Naviglio di Paderno. The layout of the village remains unaltered in respect to what it was in its medieval origins. There are noble villas with gardens and agricultural farmsteads that originated in the 1600s, for example Maria and Assunta built at the end of the 1800s and today perfectly restored and rebuilt.

MAIN PLACES OF INTEREST

TRE CORNI

The natural beauty of this section of the cyclable path of Leonardo is breathtaking. The Adda River suddenly changes its linear course because it encounters a series of rocky outcrops that surface from the bottom. The water breaks against the rocks interrupting its silent flow and creating a playful whirling and bubbling.


It is an interesting spot from an artistic perspective as well. This location is called "path of the Leonardian views" because it is here that Leonardo gained inspiration for the background of the painting The Virgin of the Rocks which is housed in the Louvre. It is also in this location that Leonardo planned the grandiose project of the canal of Paderno to help boats navigate the rapids of the river which were not navigable...



LEONARDO DA VINCI'S FERRY

Crossing the Adda river is a unique experience as is one-of-a-kind Leonardo's ferry which connects the shores of Imbersago (LC) and Villa D'Adda (BG). The vessel, faithfully reproduced from Leonardo da Vinci's sketches, is the only one still working and its mechanism, minutely studied, allows it to move without help from the

SANCTUARY OF THE MADONNA OF

This sanctuary is one of the stages of the Cloister Route (an european project that made it possible to renovate the sanctuary). The sanctuary is adorned with Renaissance and Baroque frescoes and paintings by Domenico ScarettidiPontida. It was built, together with a castle which was destroyed in 1200, in Calolziocorte,

SANTA MARIA DEL LAVELLO MONASTERY

Lecco is famous for being the town where the story of the "I Promessi Sposi" by Alessandro

Manzoni is set. Lecco is an important touristic gateway to Lago di Como, Valtellina and the beautiful Grigne mountains and the Resegone that encircle it. The town has celtic origins and it has been a Roman garrison, but its importance


grew during the Middle Ages, after it was annexed to the Duchy of Milan, for it became a strategic crossroads for goods transportation. In the second half of the 1800s, during the Austrian domination, the town went through a particularly flourishing period that brought to the construction of buildings and porticos in Neoclassical style...



PALAZZO BELGIOJOSO

This remarkable Palace of the late 1700s in the form of a U opens onto an internal garden that is now a municipal park. On the ceiling at the top of the great staircase are four medallions that date back to the second half of the 1800s that show the faces of the protagonists of The Betrothed (famous novel by Alessandro Manzoni),

while on the main floor are present traces of decorations painted in the 1700s with exotic subjects and remarkably crafted. The palace which became public property in 1927, is today a prime host museum and includes: the Museum of Natural History, the Archaeological Museum For more info: www.comune.lecco.it and the Historical Museum...




VILLA MANZONI

Villa manzoni today is a house-museum, library, and photo library. It is located not far from the center of Lecco in the neighborhood of Caleotto. Author Alessandro Manzoni spent a great part of his younger years in this summer residence of the family which eventually became the inspiration for the creation of The Betrothed.

The original building went through numerous renovations, but the most important were completed in the second half of the 1800s when, thanks to Don Pietro Manzoni father of Alessandro, it achieved its current neoclassical look with an added chapel first of all to be used privately...

SAN NICOLÒ ABBEY

Ancient Romanesque abbey from the XIth century, it has been expanded in the next three centuries by important renovating works. It was also renovated during the XVIth century when it took on a more Baroque appearance until 1831 when new works gave it the actual Neoclassical elegant style that you can appreciate today.

The abbey is worth visiting for the many 1800s and 1900s paintings it hosts. The abbey's bell tower is one of the symbols of Lecco. For more info: www.comune.lecco.it


